


Mission hospitals in India- a collage

The year 2021 continued to witness the disastrous pandemic crippling the communities across the globe. Several community hospitals had to deal with untimely loss of life. Lack of ICU care and poor infrastructure were the major problems in many hospitals and medical institutions. Upgrading the facilities in these institutions became the paramount issue and Helping Hands for Hospitals medical board immediately geared into action, kickstarting the PROJECT COVID RELIEF in addition to our regular involvement among the needy hospitals.

Initial step included planned distribution of necessary oxygen supply equipments amongst the less resourceful communities; many of whom have been rendered helpless in the current situation without a regular income. Helping hands has been working with our partners throughout the pandemic rapidly bringing protective gear to healthcare systems across India.


## Project-Covid Relief

**W**ith support from our valued donors, we have mobilised more than 150000 pieces N 95 masks and PPE kits to health care workers. More than 25 hospitals have benefitted using our free oxygen concentrators. More than 500 Pulse oximeters have been distributed to these hospitals during the past one year. Helping Hands was instrumental in bringing a consignment of much needed N-95 masks, nasal cannulas ,Bi-pap machines, Oxygen tubings, Examination gloves, Face Shield, KN95 masks, Cloth Anti Microbial Masks, Isolation Gowns, Oxygen masks, Dust Masks etc by surface transport solely for donation.

We are grateful for the support we received from our friends and the hospital administration boards which made all these possible.



## The plans turn into actions-Phase 1

A group of volunteers along with the office bearers of Helping Hands for Hospitals in the US, joined together to ensure efficient collection, packing and transportation of oxygen concentrators, ventilators and other oxygen supply equipments to India. 500 Pulse oximeters were procured and distributed among different hospitals when the demand was very high . 38 oxygen concentrators 38 voltage convertors , ventilators and washing machines were distributed in the initial stage. A great deal of work was accomplished with cooperation of these hospitals.

Helping hands for hospitals thanks its partners in the project. Procurement and distribution of medical equipment to the needy Covid relief hospitals would not have been possible without our partner in the project Gospel Echoing Missionary Society (GEMS). Mr. Dinesh Chandran, GEMS, USA was a great help in transport. A special thanks to Mr. Sam Dadala and Phillis foundation for their generous contribution towards oxygen concentrators. Dr.John Murala's support is also greatly appreciated .

## Phase-2 Logistics for the container to India

**A** container load of Covid relief supplies was sent to Chennai by surface transport from New York. Collection of items for Covid relief material to be transported was made possible by Mrs Helen Mudumalai and members of Women of Compassion, Texas. A dedicated group of volunteers joined in coordination with them during the process. Committed work by Mr Dinesh and Mr Stephen Premkumar from FMPB made the commutation and communication practicable. Their tireless efforts are commendable .

As the container reached India, Mr Wilson from Spring Sales company helped us in import, custom clearance, storage and transportation of masks and PPE kits across different hospitals in India. Heartfelt thanks to Springs Sales company for standing besides us in this great endeavour. Transportation to different hospitals was arranged by Parcel services.


