A highlight of this trip was the inauguration of a newly purchased microscope, made possible through the generosity of HHH donors. This valuable equipment has been a game-changer for the hospital.

His bedsores have healed completely, and his back remains free from new sores. However, complications persist with his suprapubic catheter, which is causing recurrent infections. He continues to rely on a colostomy bag for bowel management. Shabu's survival, following a C3-C4 fracture sustained in a fall from a tree, is nothing short of a miracle. His vibrant personality shines as a testament to his indomitable spirit, despite the adversity he has endured.







Back at Bethany Medical Center, a laparotomy was performed to successfully remove a massive 4 kg ovarian tumor. The surgery was a significant achievement, bringing relief and hope to the patient.




MISSION ENGAGEMENT AT CMC VELLORE: SHILOH PROGRAM
